

The Transfiguration of Jesus

It's around this time of the year that the church remembers the transfiguration of our Lord, the day when "his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as light. And behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him" (Mt. 17:2-3).

That, my friends, would have been an amazing thing to see! But have you ever wondered why it was Moses and Elijah who appeared with him that day?

For starters, we could certainly point out that Moses goes down in history as the great lawgiver, and Elijah, the great prophet. It was the law and the prophets, of course, that Christ came to fulfill. He himself is the prophet like Moses who was to come, and he's also a much greater Elijah.

But there's more. It so happens that Moses and Elijah were also the only ones in the Old Testament to speak with God on Mount Sinai, the place where God's word is joined with God's glory. At the transfiguration, then, is the word of the God of Israel now made flesh...and we have seen his glory.

But there's still more, because we could also recall that Moses and Elijah both had miraculous departures of their own. Moses was buried by the Lord himself, with grave site unknown, and Elijah didn't even die. So also our Lord, in his own departure, will be delivered from the grave, and his glorious body will not see corruption.

On top of all this, however, is the fact that Moses and Elijah were fellow sufferers with Christ. Moses was rejected numerous times by his own people, even though he worked miracles for them and was the meekest man on earth. Elijah was exiled and on the brink of death, even though he had the words of eternal life. So also when our Lord came to his own, his own didn't receive him.

At the end of the day, then, Moses and Elijah have a way of keeping this lofty transfiguration event grounded, by reminding us all that the only way to true glory is through suffering with Christ. In a sense, these two individuals were prime examples of those who had to undergo transfigurations of their own as they were continually being conformed to the image of God's beloved Son (Rom. 8:29).

And then, there'll be a final transfiguration for all of us, when in the twinkling of an eye we shall be changed, and our lowly bodies will be transformed into glorious bodies. As John puts it, "what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears, we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is" (1 Jn. 3:2).
