

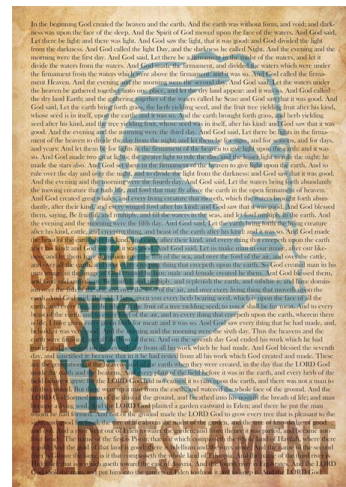

In Honor and Memory of the Rev. Dr. John Saleska



Dear Friends in Christ,

A few weeks ago, on September 12, 2017, our heavenly Father called to himself the soul of the Rev. Dr. John Saleska, Director Emeritus of the Concordia Bible Institute (CBI) and long-time seminary and college professor. Dr. Saleska founded CBI back in 2000 after retiring from his 23-year faculty position at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. In the summer of 2014 he retired a second time, as it were, by becoming the Director Emeritus of CBI, even as he maintained an office on campus and still came to work early every morning with briefcase in hand.

While we are saddened by this news of his sudden passing, we rejoice that Dr. Saleska is now beholding the face of the very One he taught and proclaimed throughout his life, Christ Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

What follows is a short piece I wrote about Dr. Saleska for a university press release:

“In an age of biblical illiteracy, Dr. Saleska’s vast memorization of the Scriptures was like a beacon of light from a bygone time. His favorite Bible, a decades-old copy of the King James Version (the version used in heaven, he liked to remind us), was littered with so many scribbles and marginal notes that it would give medieval Bibles a run for their money. Perhaps less known, however, was that he recorded podcasts without any notes or Bible of any kind, speaking into the microphone as if he were reading passages of Scripture off the plain white wall in front of him. Those who heard him teach could not miss his warm invitation to join him on an exciting journey through the Bible to find ‘Christ in Every Word,’ a lifelong conviction of his now enshrined as CBI’s tagline. His joyful confession of the Gospel along with his zeal for studying God’s Word unto life’s end make it difficult for me to imagine a more inspiring churchman. Far more than just a predecessor, he was a cherished father in the faith. I will miss him greatly.”
